We would like to begin by acknowledging that we are in Mi'kma'ki, the ancestral and unceded territory of the Mi'kmaq People. This territory is covered by the "Treaties of Peace and Friendship" which Mi'kmaq and Wolastoqiyik (Maliseet) Peoples first signed with the British Crown in 1725. The treaties did not deal with surrender of lands and resources but in fact recognized Mi'kmaq and Wolastoqiyik (Maliseet) title and established the rules for what was to be an ongoing relationship between nations.

We welcome you with open arms to our campus community. This is only the beginning in a chapter of your life and your time here will prove to be incredibly meaningful. SEPTEMBER 1

9:00am - 10:00am X-Fest Kick Off (Saputo Football Field)

Residences will be lead by the Student Leaders to the Saputo turf, where we will kick off X FEST, a week of orientation activities to help you navigate campus, services, and connect with other students. Bring your cheering voice! And wear your house shirt because you will be part of the annual Giant X Photo!

10:00am - 12:30pm Xaverian Pancake Breakfast (Keating Main Arena)

Later this week, we will have the Xaverian Welcome ceremony to formally welcome you to the Xaverian community. What it Means to be Xaverian will prepare you with what to expect for the ceremony and why it is significant to your overall academic journey. Then, we will have a panel of services you have met throughout the weekend where you can text your anonymous questions about anything at all that is on your mind before classes begin.



12:30pm - 5:00pm X-Fest Waterpark Day and Jell-o Slide (Memorial Field)

Waterpark Day is a wet day activity where students come to Memorial Field and get to play some water-based group games like Water Balloon Fights, Spikeball, and Water Gun Laser Tags. As well as have some fun on some water- based rides including; riding a Mechanical Shark, sliding down a Vertical Rush Slip n' Slide, racing friends through an inflatable Treasure Island, and getting their photos taken as they are going down the X-FEST's staple, the Jell-O Slide! It is a midday event where students get to blow off some steam and have lots of fun together with their houses before going to the Headphone Disco later that night. **This event is only open to incoming students who have bought an X-FEST Kit/Wristband and have their wristband.**



5:00pm - 7:00pm Dinner with Your Floor (Morrison Hall)

After the Waterpark Day, residence students will head over to Morrison Hall, the main dining, to have dinner together.

9:00pm Headphone Disco (Keating Main Area)

At Headphone Disco everyone is given a pair of noise cancelling headphones that are connected to two DJs. Students have the option of listening to any one of three channels at any given moment so if there is a song they do not like playing on one channel they can simply switch to another and keep the fun going! Students are supplied with neon lights, beach balls, pool noodles etc. in order to wave around in their own-clustered groups or by themselves. SEPTEMBER 2

The BLITZ! Brings three amazing training workshops to every single new student at StFX. You will rotate between the three workshops – Waves of Change, Understanding Equity Through an Anti-Oppressive Lens, and Healthy Socializing.

Your O-Week leader will give you the schedule for your residence.

Waves of Change: This workshop is designed for post-secondary students across Nova Scotia and introduces participants to the issue of sexual violence on campus. Participants will learn consent skills – recognizing a no, consent and the law, consent and intoxication, as well as an introduction to sexual violence in Nova Scotia. Participants will also be introduced to the concept of bystander intervention and will be taught various intervention techniques.

X-cited about Equity: Through an Anti-Oppressive Lens we will open our perspective through examining the systems of oppressions, 5 faces of oppression, equity groups and marginalization, and intersectionality. We will also explore the language and tools to be able to advance the decolonization of our spaces and conversations to be more inclusive and respectful of all identities in our Xaverian community.

Healthy Socializing: This session provides education on safer consumption, the new Canadian Guidelines on Drinking as well as an understanding of Naloxone and how to access it in case of an emergency. We focus on understanding the resources and supports available to students in order to reduce the harms while working to dismantle the oppressive ways that language, advertising and media enforce substance use on university campuses.

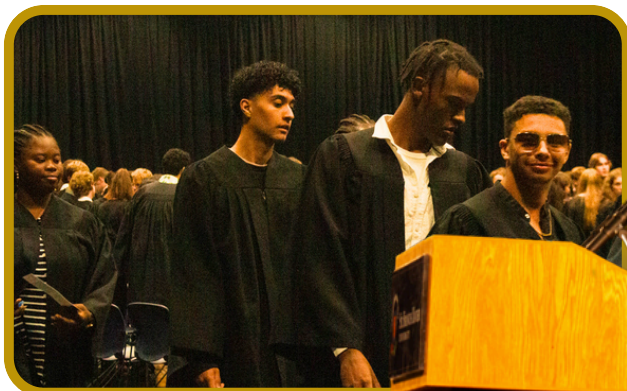

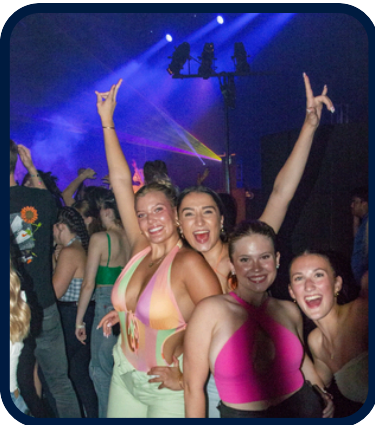
